# President's Message by Kendra Biddick

Dear ALOG Members:

As I write this, it is the middle of March, my birthday was a few days ago. I grew up in Evanston, Illinois, the first suburb along Lake Michigan north of Chicago. I always envied the children who had birthdays in the warmer months because they could have parties outdoors. I guess I really loved the outdoors even then.

You know me as primarily a fiber artist, but I have another great artistic love, my garden. It is art on a grand scale, and it is on my mind all year. I spend time over the winter researching plants for my garden and planning which plants I want to move around. This winter I fenced off my yard to exclude the deer so that my native plant garden can flourish. I'm excited to see what will finally be able to bloom in my yard this year. I'm also looking forward to planning a much more layered, purposeful garden than I have in the past. It won't happen all at once because it is expensive to buy plants and time-consuming to get them planted, especially in the rocky soil prevalent in this part of the country.

This ½ acre canvas is completely different from a painting canvas. The light available to plants varies from almost none to full sun, and the available water varies from watered every few days, to quickly draining off a hillside. My immediate goal is to have as many different native plants as possible, with a few of my favorite exotic plants, such as irises included. My overall goal is much more serious: to provide food, shelter, and water for as many insects and insect species as possible so that I can support as many birds as possible. With luck I will inspire others to do likewise and help grow the <u>Homegrown National Park</u>. Accomplishing this requires thinking in four dimensions: horizontally, vertically, and over time as the angle of the sun changes, and the plants grow, bloom, go dormant, and grow some more. I have to admit that one of my favorite parts of both gardening and felting is the problem-solving. How can I achieve the results I intend?

#### **Dates to Remember:** Wednesday, April 30: Art Take-in 5-7 pm in the Kay Gallery

- Please remember to label your artwork with your name, title, and price on a small piece of paper on the front and back. This is very important so that we correctly label the artwork during installation.
- You may have up to 30 cards, 10 unique bin items (no canvases, items should be in clear bags, no zip lock bags). These items do not need to have an inventory, but they should be labeled with your three initials, name, title, and price. Cards need only your three initials and price. Bin items and cards may be restocked as they sell.
- Patrons will be able to take artwork at the point of sale. Artists that sell may fill in with another work if it is similar in size and fits the flow of the gallery.
- Please send me images of any work that you want to fill in for sold art. If you do not have another piece to fill in, a sign will be placed acknowledging the sale.

Some time ago, I was cleaning out bookshelves and came across a little hardback notebook with a red cover and all blank pages. I decided to use it for something that has now become very dear to me.

I send it home with my students, one at a time. I ask them to write whatever they want about art. I let them know that the rest of my students, including me, will read what they write and we all help each other in doing so. There is no due date, just bring it back when you've put

your thoughts down.

I started this back in 2015, ten years ago. One of those wonderful students is now gone from this world and I read her words with extra affection. She had a wonderful sense of humor and has, so far, written the most of anyone who had contributed to this book.

I find that the thoughtful introspection of the artist's life and thoughts is somewhat singular to an artist. After all, we work alone in creating our paintings. Standing back to look at one's art as it is developing is similar to doing this mental standing back. Hopefully it creates an understanding of what it means to be an artist, to bring one's own view of things to this world, to make that which has never been done before, ever.

I suggest that you make such a book for yourself, of your own thoughts. Maybe even invite other artists you know to put their ideas and such into it.

Every time I have read this little red book again, I get more out of it. And oh! Some have put in wonderful drawings along with their thoughts. I consider the whole thing a gift. And just because I was cleaning out my bookshelves!

# From the Drawing Board by Bill Mapes



Retirement hasn't been what I expected. Leisure time has somehow eluded me over the past many years. As I grow older, I have begun to consider the importance of what I do with the time I have. Sounds a bit solemn, but I mean it in a very constructive way. I never had a "bucket list" but recently I have thought about some of the things I would like to do or see that have slipped by through a busy life. For example, I have always wanted to see the Alamo. Probably a fantasy from my childhood ala Disney's Davey Crockett saga. In fact, I had the opportunity a few years back and made the trip. It was wonderful to walk through the chapel and experience in my mind's eye what those early Texans experienced.

Since then, I have pondered other trips and other challenges in my life that brings the same satisfaction and fulfillment. This is all leading to an art related experience, so hang in there.

Among the "wants" in my art life was to paint effectively with confidence using watercolor. I have always shied away from the medium thinking of how difficult it was to use and master. So, break out this spring and experiment with other mediums or approaches to your art. You may be surprised with how easy it is and how wonderful the experience can be.

# The Photography Study Group is on The Move! by Derrick C. Tabor

It is hard to believe that it was in July of 2024 when emails around forming an ALOG photography study group were circulating, thanks to our President Kendra Biddick.

One of those emails included a proposal from ALOG member David McKeown: "I am most interested in going out in the field to do landscapes and macro photography on a monthly basis."



Flash forward to March 22, 2025—the ALOG Photography Study Group made its first field trip! On the first Saturday where the weather was accommodating to holding a camera and taking pictures outdoors, four of us traveled to Lake Whetstone in Montgomery Village.

Lake Whetstone is my favorite place to observe and capture images of the great blue heron and other members of the heron family known to frequent the Lake and to reside on the island at the lake. The lake is a longstanding nesting place of herons. I have counted over several years more than 30 nests fully established by June. Consequently, when visiting the lake in early spring, one can observe herons fishing and actively gathering materials for their nests. So, if you are interested in capturing images of these birds,

one of the best locations is within a short drive of BlackRock Center of the Arts.

We were in the field for about 2 hours. Here are a few images of a great blue heron resting on the side of a small lake across the street from Lake Whetstone. I also captured images of three ALOG Photography Study Group members doing what photographers do in the wild.





The Athenaeum Gallery is dedicated to showcasing the wide variety of excellent work being created by artists in the DC/MD/VA region. An average of eight shows are mounted per year. Each one with an opening reception and many with ancillary programs such as gallery talks, demonstrations, children's workshops, or even modern dance performances choreographed specially for the space and the art.

The characteristics that define us can be physical such as a red hair or calloused hands

- or intangible such as a generous heart or sharp wit. In this exhibition the Athenaeum Gallery intends to represent the wide manner that DMV artists capture a person's (or persons') essence.

Visual interpretations of the theme might range from traditional portraiture to abstract and conceptual artworks. We are looking for works that represent the gamut of qualities that define our understanding of particular individuals (both singly or in groups)—including behavioral characteristics and inner emotional life.

Aesthetic quality is always important to the Athenaeum Gallery – but sometimes the most poignant and telling work comes from unexpected sources. Career artists, emerging artists, and people who do not consider themselves an artist at all are encouraged to enter. If the work successfully conveys the essence of a person, it will be considered.








Come hang out in The Treehouse—a place to slow down and reflect on our interconnectedness with the natural world, a place to vibe, a place to jam, a place to be. A collaborative, immersive, multisensory, exploration, The Treehouse first and foremost exalts the tree. Trees provide us with air and soil, building materials, musical instruments, shelter for animals and humans, shade, beauty, and so much more.

The sitting rooms in The Treehouse are furnished with Michael Marschark's live edge tree boards and furniture, Adam David Greene's intuitive watercolor abstractions, and Chris Wikman's landscape drawings and nature photography. The three artists also form a musical collective that will occasionally host open, improvisational jams in the space. The sound work that fills the exhibition also comes from their collaboration.

The initial concept of The Treehouse grew from Michael Marschark's live edge furniture. "The slices of the trees [guide me] to the design of the furniture," the artist says of his process, "The pieces highlight the tree's shape, grain, patterns and colors left by beetles and resulting fungus, worm patterns, woodpecker holes and the decay that supports new life." Marschark soon realized that he was designing a social gathering space as much as an exhibition and brought in creative kindred spirits Adam David Greene and Chris Wikman to add their works to the communal vibe.

Marschark, who for 20 years worked as a pediatric occupational therapist supporting students with severe disabilities, also sees education as crucial to his work. Informational posters will provide background on his process and a block box will encourage kids of all ages to touch and experiment with raw materials.


