I've been concentrating on illustrative drawing/painting during the past 2 years since I joined Zoom drawing sessions with Silhouette and Shadow, DCAMC and Drop Dead Gorgeous Drawing. All three emphasize models with numerous styles. I have always loved life drawing, portraiture and fashion illustration so I found my calling with all three. S&S is based in Chicago but the models are from all over the world - male and female of all backgrounds. sizes and specialties. DCAMC is the DC Art Models Collective with local models which many here are probably familiar with. They are clothed in various costumes with themes and styles. Drop Dead Gorgeous Drawing is based in London and features fashion Illustration in many styles with some sessions led by professional illustrators. I have honed and improved my drawing/painting of the human figure and developed my own "style" of expression with gesture poses as a great warm-up.

We are on a "sabbatical" at present but I am creating pieces for future shows as well as my own satisfaction - I've begun a new series of ceramic hand-built pieces titled "Beauty is in the Eye of the Beholder" as well as more illustrated wall tiles.

I do a lot of signage for various events, programs etc. and am now involved with making the chalkboard signs/ illustrations for a new restaurant/bistro in Olney called Scratch Kitchen. Returning and Moving Forward

I am writing this because I hope it helps you if you need it!

These last few years have been the oddest of my life, especially for my life as an artist. I don't have to tell you the many ways it impacted me, because surely it did almost the same to each one of you. However, for a good while, I wondered if I was ever going to pick up my brush again. Then I did a little bit, finishing one that I had started BEFORE Covid and then more recently, a little one inspired by an outing to a winery that had a beautiful lavender field. But it was VERY little by my usual level of painting activity.

Many months ago I started working very slowly on a new one, getting the composition just right. It took me way longer than such things ever have. I kept messing with the contents on the table with my still life set-up. Then months passed without doing anything. Finally I began drawing my set-up. Then, in the middle of that drawing, I got rid of one of the elements which wasn't working and found another item to replace it. I began sketching it out on canvas. All of this, mind you, took MONTHS. That is NOT my usual way of working!

What you may not know about me is that I paint fast. Really fast. I get my idea, I get the materials for it and go to town. Sometimes I have to wait for a layer of oil paint to dry, but if I don't have to wait, I just keep going until satisfied. This way of doing things has been my routine for years now. Until Covid.

Why am I writing about this? Because maybe I'm not the only one who felt lost during all this and maybe what you will read here will give you hope, if you haven't already found it yourself. I have to say I admire those of you who kept going with your creative work in spite of the way our lives were slammed these past years. But I wasn't one of them. I did find a great deal to do in the way of projects involving thousands (yes, thousands) of family papers, clippings, photographs, slides, negatives and more. But I am an artist and what happened with that?

Yesterday I had a huge win. After my student had left, I stayed in the studio and painted for three hours straight!! This is a big deal to me because of the very long period where I have not done it at all, and only in an erratic way.

I doubt I would have written about this if yesterday's long painting session hadn't happened. But it did and now I wish to stay firmly on the path that has been my life for so many years. Stay tuned!

Formatting Guidelines for Submitting Photographs

Photographs of our artwork and events are an important way to publicize our craft and art league. Here is the format for submitting images for our newsletter, website Gallery page, Facebook, etc.

Each image should be 180 dpi or greater and 4" or larger on the longest dimension of the image

With the shadow of pandemic gradually diminishing, the summer has once again flown by. Fall will be a welcome relief from the "dog days" of traditional August heat. September is the advent of a new exciting

year for ALOG. It is a banner year as we celebrate our 40th Anniversary as an organized group. What a great accomplishment and service to the local art community. Congratulations members.

To celebrate our anniversary, we will be dedicating our spring show to our durability, as well as our creativity. As you may be aware, we now have reconstructed our BlackRock shows from two weekend events to one extended single show in the spring. This will give us more community exposure while reducing the added work that producing two shows entails. ne BlackRock show also opens other opportunities to exhibit at other venues.

On that front we have our annual Kentlands exhibit which will load in late January and be on display for three months. This will be our 10th juried exhibit at Kentlands along with cash awards.

But that is not all on the show front. ALOG has been afforded an exciting and new exhibit opportunity that fits in nicely this fall. You probably that seen the emails for this event and hopefully submitted entries. The Kisco Carnegie Discovery Center, a senior living facility, in Downtown Crown currently has a small gallery space and adjoining sample apartment (154 square foot space) that can average a 25-piece exhibit. This is a good prospect for more immediate exposure of our artwork with growing opportunity in the future.

Eventually, when the main community is built, there will be a larger gallery area and an arts center, providing opportunities for further exhibitions, demonstrations, lectures, and teaching. We would be one of the foundation groups to help grow this venture. It has unlimited and exciting possibilities. I am personally excited that it would eventually provide a third permanent exhibit on our schedule along with the Kentlands Exhibit and our Spring Show. The exhibiting schedule would potentially be spread throughout the ALOG year allowing for ample preparation for each event.

Your board of directors and show chairperson work behind the scenes to provide the leadership and opportunities that have led our group successfully through the years. It is a cooperative and volunteer group that all members should consider being a part of. It is an opportunity that yields experiences that all aspiring artists will use as their art careers grow.
